AN ACT to amend Tennesee Code Annotated, Title 9 relative to precious metals.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1. Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 9, Chapter 1, is amended by adding the following as a new section:

- (a) As used in this section:
  - (1) "Coins" means:
  - (A) Precious metal fabricated into products of uniform shape, size, design, content, weight, and purity that are suitable for or customarily used as currency, as a medium of exchange, or as the medium for purchase, sale, storage, transfer, or delivery of precious metal in retail or wholesale transactions; or
  - (B) Refined precious metal bullion, stamped or imprinted with its weight and purity and valued primarily based on its metal content and not its form;
- (2) "Legal tender" means a recognized medium of exchange for the payment of debts and taxes;
- (3) "Person" means an individual; state, local government, political subdivision, or any agent or agency thereof; company; corporation; partnership; firm; trust; organization; or association; and
  - (4) "Precious metal" means gold and silver.
- (b) Precious metal coins are legal tender in this state.
- (c) A person shall not compel another person to use or accept precious metal coins as legal tender, unless expressly agreed to or authorized by law or contract.
- SECTION 2. This act takes effect upon becoming a law, the public welfare requiring it.
